INDEX

The Daniel Cemetery is located about three miles southwest of Greencastle, one mile due south of Highway 6. The cemetery was incorporated for perpetual care September 24, 1973.

Information for Daniel Cemetery was compiled and submitted by Opal Conwell Huffman (Mrs. O.T. Huffman) of Novinger. The plat for the cemetery and records were completed by Maple Irene Moore Abernathy and Golda Daniel Williams. As children, they lived nearby and all their lives have helped care for the cemetery. They are the authorities for the names of the persons buried here. Many graves have no stones and some existing stones are illegible. The parents of these two persons, Hester and "Jeff "Moore and Nancy and Harvey Daniel are buried here, but Irena is buried in Greencastle Cemetery with her husband, John Abernathy. Golda's husband, Millard Daniel, is buried in the Green City Cemetery.

The Daniel Cemetery is located in western Adair County, being one acre off the S.W. Quarter of the NW Quarter of Section 29, Twp.63, Range 17.

This is a portion of the Joseph Henry Daniels homestead. The legal description may be found in the Adair County Recorder's Office, which shows that the Daniel estate was settled by a Sheriff's sale of partition on the 31st day of October, 1902. At this time, an acre was set aside for a cemetery and a road was set aside for an access to the same. Family records furnished by Golda (Daniel) Williams, daughter of Harvey and Nancy (Snodgrass) Daniel show that Joseph Henry Daniel and his wife, Clarissa (Patty) Miller Daniel, with several children, migrated to this part of Missouri from near Springfield, Illinois in 1858.

They traveled in a covered wagon drawn by oxen. In addition to the family they brought cows, chickens, iron pots and pans, a big iron kettle, a spinning wheel, and a carpet loom.

They settled in a wilderness where turkey, deer, and other wildlife was abundant. They built a log house and soon planted wheat, corn, vegetables and an orchard for which they were well known.

I (Opal Comwell Huffman) have heard my mother (Angeline Moore Comwell, b 1870), tell a story about this orchard. It seems that everyone called Clarrisa Daniel "Granny Daniel". Mama and her brothers and sisters passed "Granny's" going to and coming home from the school which was called The Wilderness, and later called Liberty School. As these hungry children came home from school, "Granny" would come to the doorway, and call to them, "Children, go through the orchard and get some apples." Mama said these were welcome words and they always took the windfalls.

Clarissa (Patty) and her sister were born in Ireland, Clarissa married a man named Miller and they had two sons, James and John. She and her sister pushed a cart along the Cumberland route into the interior. She had no shoes and wrapped her feet in cloth. Later she married Joseph Henry Daniel, of French descent, and they lived near Springfield, Illinois

Joseph Henry Daniel was the first of his family to die in Missouri and to be buried on their farm in what became the Daniel Cemetery. Most of his children and their wives or husbands are buried here. Also, Neighbors buried members of their families here. In 1978, there were forty graves.

For many years, numbers of the Daniel, Moore, and Clifton families met, and cleaned and fenced the cemetery. As the years passed, fewer and fewer were left to do the work.

Mable (Irena) Moore Abernathy was concerned that it would be without care; so she willed a fractional part of her estate (\$812.00) to be used by her executors, O.T. (Ted) Huffman and Floyd Moore, as a fund for its perpetual care.

On Saturday, August 4, 1973, a meeting for all concerned was held at the home of O.T. Huffman. An organization

was completed with Roy Daniel, Pres; Wm.R. Clifton, Vice President; and Opal L. Huffman, Sec. Treasurer.


It was decided that, with the advice of attorney, R.M. Gifford, Green, Green City, the association should be incorporated under the laws of the State of Missouri and By -Laws be printed. This was done.

At the end of 1978, following many meetings and donations, the association owns a C.D. from the Bank of Kirksville in the amount of \$950.00. The interest is payable to the checking account and is being used for the upkeep of the cemetery.

The Officers and Trustees in 1978 are: Pres. Roy Daniel, Vice-Pres. Wm H. Clifton, Sec.Treas., Opal L. Huffman, Lowell Moore, Floyd Moore, Alice Daniel, Herbert Daniel, Bornie (Moore) Ray, Golda (Daniel) Williams.
